To Whom It May Concern:

Lang Masonry's work for Franklin County on the Huntington Park Project's Left Field Building was managed by Turner Construction Company. This project consisted of a free-standing, three story building that included structural masonry block, architectural block walls, limestone details, and a complete brick facade on both structural stud sheathing and masonry backup. This facility contains concessions, restrooms, gift shop, and ticket booth on the first level; the Hall of Fame bar, kitchen and restrooms on the club level and an open space pavilion with bars, restaurant and bleacher seating on the Terrace Level.

The quality of the work performed by Lang was very good. Their attention to detail was critical to pull off the architect's desire for this building to look like it has always been on this site and that the ballpark was placed in this location to utilize an "existing" warehouse type structure. Lang understands the importance of the work in the brick cavity including the flashing details that were mocked up for the Architects' approval. The end product is a great looking building that is part of the overall project that was awarded the best new ballpark in 2009 by ballparks.com. It should be noted that this facility won this award over both the New York Met's new stadium as well as the new Yankee's Stadium.


Schedule was critical on this project due to the hard date for opening day. Lang provided the proper manpower, equipment and materials necessary to complete their work to ensure that the trades that followed were able to stay on or beat the critical path dates. It was especially important for the structural masonry to be complete through the winter months for the steel erection to begin in the spring. Lang Masonry worked with a focus on schedule.

Lang worked on the Huntington Park Project without a lost time accident. Their focus on safety was evident when they used plywood on their mobile scaffolding on the east elevation of the building to ensure that no debris fell off of the scaffolding onto the active street in the near vicinity below.

There was great pride in the Lang Employees that worked on the Huntington Park Project, this was evident in the quality of the work, meeting schedule requirements and working safely on the project. It was also evident that they were united by wearing the same highly visible Lang Masonry shirts on a daily basis.

I look forward to working with Lang Masonry again in the future. We appreciate the professionalism and quality that can be found in both Lang's office and field staff.
